

I have attached a Key Word Sign Christmas calendar to aid communication and have a bit of signing fun at home during the holiday period. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.





- 2. Then, get your hands in there and rub the ingredients together between your fingers.
- 3. Your sand is ready when it holds its shape when squeezed, but breaks apart easily.
- 4. Transfer your shaping sand into the container
